If cell phones are brought, **we will securely store the phones** once we arrive to the camp property **on Monday afternoon** and hold them **until** we depart from the property on **Friday morning**.

Phones are a normal part of their life and staying connected is important. But at camp, we believe students must be *fully present* to build friendships, have fun, and hear from Jesus.

After doing years of student camp, we have witnessed phones significantly distract from all the good things we are praying would happen. This phone policy reflects best practices at nearly every major church camps, increases your return on investment, and reduces distraction.

Once camp is over, we believe students will not miss their phones as much as they'll cherish the memories of bonding with their friends and drawing near to Jesus.
