Dear Kids Worship Families,

Welcome to the "WORLD TOUR 2024: Among the Nations; Among the Peoples" edition of the NO LIMITS book! We pray that as you work through each devotional, God will speak to you and challenge you to be "Kids Who Share" Christ! I am so excited about this concert. The songs are packed with the message of GOD'S LOVE, and they are also fun to sing. The book you are holding is a set of devotions to help you and your child go deeper into God's word and really understand the message behind each song. You will also learn about people who shared the Gospel with other nations. And you



will learn a little about the cultures of the countries we will "visit." Parents, I am asking you to be involved and help your child complete this book. This is a GREAT resource to help with family worship!

We want to encourage parents to do these devotionals with your child (children). Especially the first two weeks, there may be some words and concepts parents will need to help explain. I felt it was important that instead of "shying away" from certain verses because of the "big words" that our children must be exposed to the truth of God's Word!!! We have included web sites to help us "go deeper." Parents should always be with their child when going on the internet. Also, be sure to encourage your child to participate in the weekly Hotline Challenge! These are fun for the kids and I love to hear their messages!

One of the most important aspects of the **NO LIMITS** devotions is the fact that children learn scripture for every song. We want the children to continue to "hide God's Word in their hearts" not just memorize a verse so they can "complete a week." Please encourage your child to memorize and learn the Scriptures and be able to say them to their choir worker each week. (They also get extra points!)

In April, children will be challenged each week to share a tract (given to them in choir) with one person. We want each child to bring that name to choir and write the name of the person on a card (footprint). We will pray for those names each week. We want to share God's love "around our world" by May 19!

DAY I WELCOME TO READ ABOUT IT!

READ I JOHN 4:15-17

What are the first two words of our Bible verse?
By what? Look in verse 16. What do you think the word "this" is referring?

Verse 15: What happens when we "confess that Jesus is the Son of God?"

With God's love abiding (living) inside us, He is making us more and more like Him. One day, we will be able to stand before God with the excitement of knowing that there will be no more sin and we get to live with Jesus forever and ever.

Look at the last phrase in verse 17. It says, "because as He is, so also are we in this world." A paraphrase that is "in this world, we will be like Jesus!" What we sing!

What are some ways you think you can "be like Jesus?"	



Hold a mirror in front of you—whose "image" is received? What happens when you turn the mirror a different direction? We must constantly be using Jesus as our "mirror image" – not looking and comparing ourselves with other people. What happens when you hold up the mirror in the dark? Probably nothing. A mirror needs light to reflect. Jesus is the Light of the world. The more you read your Bible, go to church, Sunday School, MDWK, and choir, the more you will learn about Jesus and get to know Him. The more you focus on Jesus, the more you will be like Him.



Dear Jesus, Thank You for wanting to make me be more like You. Thank You for giving me the Bible to help me learn more about You and how to be like You. Please help me to be a reflection of You so that "in this world, I can be like Jesus." Thank You for promising that You will live in me when I repent of my sin and confess Jesus as the Son of God. Please help me to be confident of Your love for me and to share Your love with others. Please bless my choir director as she prepares for this week's rehearsal. MISSIONARY STORIES WILLIAM CAREY 1761-1834

William Carey, also known as the "Father of Modern Missions," was an English Baptist preacher who became the first missionary to India. He is also known for translating the entire Bible into Bengali.

Carey was born in England to Anglican parents Edmund and Elisabeth Carey. He began a shoe-making apprenticeship at fourteen and later became a shoemaker. When Carey was 17, one of his fellow apprentices taught him Scripture, and he believed.

After his conversion, Carey started studying the Bible seriously. Though he never received a formal education, He was exceptionally talented with languages. He taught himself Greek, Hebrew, Dutch and French while working as a cobbler. And by age 31, Carey could read the Bible in seven languages.

Carey quickly became known for his biblical knowledge. And in 1783, he was invited to preach every other Sunday at a Baptist church. He continued working as a cobbler to support his family until 1789 when he became a full-time pastor of another Baptist church. One day during a ministers' meeting, Carey suggested the local church send their missionaries overseas. He had read David Brainerd's biography and felt burdened to preach Christ to unreached nations.

But he was shut down by another minister who said, "Sit down, young man, sit down and be still. When God wants to convert the heathen, He will do it without consulting either you or me."

Carey did not give up. Shortly after that meeting, he wrote and published "An Enquiry into the Obligations of Christians to use Means for the Conversion of the Heathens." In this treatise, Carey argued it was every Christian's duty to carry out the Great Commission and he chastised those who neglected it. He became

the first Baptist preacher to apply the Great Commission to all Christians, not just the twelve disciples (Matthew 28:19-20).

And in the spring of 1793, Carey and a few others sailed to India as missionaries and began the missionary movement as we know it today.

Despite extensive hardships, hard labor, and considerable opposition from businesses and the Indian government, Carey remained in India for 41 years. During this time, he led hundreds of Indians to Christ and translated the Bible into several local languages. He also founded a college to train Indians for missionary work among their people.

Carey's life and work did not only impact the Indians. It also inspired many others, such as David Livingstone and Adoniram Judson, to give up their lives for Christ through international missions.

Modern missions wouldn't be what it is today if it wasn't for Carey's life. His life shows how God can use one person to affect many generations.

"We know the Truth." Do you think God gave us His truth to keep it to ourselves? He has given us the command to take the truth and share it with everyone we can. You can share the Truth with people in your neighborhood, your school, your ballpark, or dance class. Where is God calling you to serve!!! Loving others the way God loves us will do two things: 1) will bring unbelievers to Christ; 2) will keep believers strong and united in a world that is not friendly to the things of God. Loving like Jesus loves means helping when it's not convenient, being more concerned about others than ourselves, and accepting hurtful things (words) without fighting back. We can only do those things by Jesus' power. Another reason it is so important to be in God's Word EVERYDAY!

Please help me to read the Bible every day so I can learn Your Truth, live Your Truth (be like You), and share Your Truth with others. Thank You that You give the power to do so. GOD KNOWS YOU! (Verses 1-6)

What are some of the things Psalm 139 says God knows about you?

God knows you and God LOVES YOU – personally and individually! He knows you better than any person in your life! God knows your heart. To God, the most important part of you is your heart – who you really are on the inside. In these verses, David recognized God's presence, power, and knowledge. He celebrated the fact that God knew EVERYTHING about him! I like that word – CELEBRATE. You celebrate on your birthday, right? You can celebrate with God every day! Celebrate that God loves you; He knows you, He made you!



God made you exactly how He wanted you to be. God gave you specifically to your mom and dad (whether biological or foster or adopted). If you have brothers or sisters or not, God put you in that family for a reason. Nothing God does is an accident. God LOVES you and has put you in your family for a special reason. And those people usually know us the best. Right? But sometimes we can fool even those who know us best because we will hide our feelings or not talk about something. But you can never fool God on how you feel or what you are thinking. He knows what you are going to say before you even say it! Are there thoughts or intentions in your heart that are displeasing to

God? Others may not know about those thoughts, but God does... that's why we need to ask God to forgive us and help us have a clean heart, and nice thoughts towards others. It's why we can talk to God anytime and tell Him anything. He knows it anyway! He wants us to tell Him. This helps us be honest and real with ourselves! We can "cry out" to God anytime, anywhere, and about anything.

MISSIONARY STORIES HUDSON TAYLOR 1832 - 1905

James Hudson Taylor was the first Christian missionary to China, where he spent 51 years preaching the gospel. During his mission years, Hudson led thousands of Chinese to Christ, translated the Bible into local dialects, and founded the China Inland Mission (now OMF International).

Taylor was born in 1832 in Yorkshire, England, to Methodist parents James and Amelia Taylor. Despite growing up in a devout family, Taylor was not of the faith. Tried hard as he could, he could not make himself a Christian. So his mother and sister prayed daily for his salvation. The Lord heard their prayers.

One day, while reading an evangelistic tract, God changed Taylor's heart, and he experienced spiritual birth. Around that time, Taylor also felt God's calling to the mission field in China. So he spent the next few years preparing for it by learning medicine, Mandarin, and Scripture.

In September 1853, four years after his conversion, Taylor sailed for China with the Chinese Evangelization society. Upon his arrival, Taylor noticed many of the other missionaries adopted worldly lifestyles and rarely went to poor and rural areas. Taylor, however, had a burning desire to see the gospel reach deep within mainland China. Therefore, just a few

months after he arrived, Taylor traveled to the interior of China to share the gospel. And within his first two years, he made ten inland trips.

In 1857, Taylor became an independent missionary after the Chinese Evangelization could not support him. He met his wife, Maria, and they had eight children (three who died at childbirth). In 1860, Taylor returned to England due to health problems but continued his mission work by translating the Bible into a Chinese dialect. He was passionate about evangelistic efforts for unreached peoples in China. In June 1865, Taylor founded the China Inland Mission with William Thomas Berger. Within a year, the organization had twenty-two missionaries, and in May 1866, they all sailed for China.

In 1870, Taylor lost his infant son and his wife. This deeply affected Taylor's health and he returned to England. The next year, Taylor married again and returned to China in 1905. When Hudson Taylor died, he was buried in China next to his first wife.

Taylor's life is a testament to the power of prayer in a believer's life and a model of complete trust in God.

DAY 3 WELCOME TO READ ABOUT IT!

GOD IS EVERYWHERE! READ PSALM 139:7-12

A "paraphrase" (simple version) of these verses: "Lord, it is impossible for me to get away from you. There is nowhere I can go where You are not there. You are everywhere! You lead me wherever I go. I cannot hide from You. Even when it's dark, I am never alone."

How does it make you feel to know that God knows everything about you and is everywhere you go?	
Is there a place you have to go sometimes that you are very glad to know that God is there with you?	

"I cannot go anywhere that God is not there." WOW! God is with you at home, at school, at church, and at extra activities. God is with you when you play, when you study, when you practice, and when you sing. God is with you when you are talking to your friend, and you think no one else can hear. God is with you in your room when you think no one else can see. How do you think you will live your life this week knowing that God is with you everywhere you are? Keep that thought in your head and it will help you make good choices.

GOD MADE ME! READ PSALM 139:13-18

What two verbs are used in verse 13?

These are "word pictures." When I think about the word "formed," I think of a sculptor working with a piece of clay. He takes the clay and using his hands, he molds and shapes it or carves and etches into that piece of clay exactly the features and characteristics wanted. When a person creates a piece of artwork, decorates a room, or writes a piece of literature, you can actually see the personality and character of the creator. GOD formed you, He created you, and HIS CHARACTER is in you!!! As the Bible tells us, God made us in His image. His Spirit is ready and willing to work in you. In God's eyes, you are His priceless masterpiece.

Have you ever watched anyone "knit" something—a blanket, scarf, sweater? Knitting is not an easy skill. Here are a couple of ways knitting is explained:

Knitting requires a lot of fine muscle control and coordination, quite a lot of mental

focusing, patience, and perseverance.

Knitting is a process of using long needles to interlink or knot a series of loops made by one continuous thread. Each loop or knot connects to another one, and when enough loops have been made, the result is whatever the one knitting determines.



God knit you together one stitch at a time as you were formed in your mother's womb. He created you exactly to be the result HE wanted.

God created you. You are fearfully and wonderfully made! God determined every detail about you! There will be people in this world who may try to tell you otherwise. They might say something negative about how you look or talk - you just remind yourself and them that you are FEARFULLY and WONDERFULLY made in the image of God. And "God don't make junk!" He created you to be HIS masterpiece. He created you to do good things for Him.

DAY I. WELCOME TO READ ABOUT IT!

READ ROMANS 5:8

Mungu Anakupenda means God LOVES you! (Swahili)

God's love for you will *never* end. We learned last week that God loves you because He **made** you. This week we will learn *how much* God loves you.

According to our memory verse, when did God show His love to us?
Now add "God loved me while" and say it out loud.
GOD SENT JESUS TO DIE ON THE CROSS FOR US NOT BECAUSE WE WERE GOOD ENOUGH, BUT BECAUSE HE LOVED US!
READ ROMANS 3:23; 6:23; 5:8. What are some words that come to mind when you think about the word sin?
Sin is not fun to talk about because it makes us feel bad. However, it is important that we recognize and know when we sin and what sin is and what sin does. Romans 3:23 says have sinned. Who?
Do you think that leaves anyone out?
Every single person in the whole wide world has sinned! It doesn't matter if you are a "good" person or a "bad" person. It doesn't really matter what you have done. It doesn't even matter how hard you try to be good. There is no way for us to be good enough! God is perfect and does not sin. God is HOLY and we are not. Sin is what separates us from God. Is that bad news or good news?
What does Romans 6:23 say is the <i>payment</i> (wage) for sin? YIKES! That is eternal separation from God! That's definitely bad news.
But is that the end of verse 23? Here comes the really good news! What is the gift that God wants to give each of us?



Whenever you feel uncertain about God's love for you, remember that He loved you even before you turned to Him. If God loved you when you were a "rebel" (not following Jesus), He is sure to be there for you, strengthen, and guide you now that you love Him and follow Him. You can know absolutely for sure that God loves you and His love for you will never end! God wants us to be with Him in heaven forever! God does not want us to be separated from Him because of our sin. He loves you so much that He sent His only Son Jesus to die on the cross to pay the price for sin. *That is the best news ever!*



Dear Jesus, Thank You for loving me before I loved You. Thank You for sending Jesus to die on the cross for me. Please help me to always remember that You love me even when I do not act the right way; and that You will never stop loving me. Please help me to love others the way You want me to love and not whether I think they deserved it or not. Thank You for loving me more than I could ever imagine. MISSIONARY STORIES

DAVID LIVINGSTONE

1813-1873

David Livingstone was a Scottish physician, missionary, slave abolitionist, and explorer who spent decades exploring and evangelizing Africa. He is also famous for his contribution to abolishing the African slave trade and starting the "scramble for Africa" movement.

Livingstone was born on March 19 in Blantyre, a small town near Glasgow, Scotland. When he was 21, he became interested in missionary work after reading a pamphlet calling for missionaries to China with a medical background.

Consequently, he began studying medicine and theology in Glasgow to become a missionary doctor. In 1838, The London Missionary Society accepted Livingstone but could not send him to China due to the First Opium War. But in God's providence, Livingstone met Robert Moffat, a Scottish missionary in southern Africa who told him about Africa, "the smoke of a thousand villages where no missionary had been before." Livingstone got excited by this prospect, and in March 1841, he arrived at Cape Town, South Africa.

He spent the next ten years moving through the interior of Africa to reach people with the gospel of Christ and free them from slavery. But it was only after his seventh year that Livingstone saw his first convert.

Livingstone's work in Africa also exposed him to the immense evil of slavery throughout the continent. During his time in Africa, he fought relentlessly to see this practice abolished. In 1853, Livingstone embarked on a journey to explore the entire continent of Africa. His voyages and discoveries gave him

international recognition.

Livingstone's journeys were fraught with trials as he constantly faced slave traders, hostile tribals, and severe illnesses. Nevertheless, he persevered in his mission and traveled from the West coast of Africa to the East coast for over three years, exploring and sharing the gospel.

Afterward, he went to England for the first time since he left for Africa and arrived to hero's welcome. He returned to Africa a few years later with his wife and youngest son. But four years after their return to Africa, Mary died of disease.

Livingstone was so heartbroken by her death that the Royal Geographical Society had to call him back to England.

But in 1866, he eventually returned to Africa one last time without any societies or governments involved. He spent the remaining years going further into Africa in his quest to find the source of the Nile and abolish the slave trade. But his poor health hindered him, and in May 1873, Livingstone took his last breath while kneeling in prayer at his bedside in Chitambo.

The servants who found him removed his heart from his chest and buried it in Africa (for embalming). The remainder of his body was interred in Westminster Abbey.

With his last words he wrote, 'All I can add in my solitude is may heaven's rich blessing come down on everyone, American, English, or Turk who will help to heal this open sore of the world."'



God loves you and wants you to tell others about Him!

In just a few verses, what phrase do we read three times?

Once again, God is telling us something through repetition. Remember when something is repeat-

ed, we know the person doing the "repeating" really wants us to get it! God does that over and over again in the Bible. He wants us to "get" everything He has written in His Word, but there are some principles that He especially wants us to learn. Loving others is one of those principles. The world wants to turn the phrase around to confuse our understanding of love. The world would have us believe that "love" is whatever makes us feel good. That way of thinking is very selfish and directly opposite of God. We must remember that "God is love" and we should love like God loves. How are we to love the way God loves? Most people believe that love is important. Some people believe that love is just a feeling. That is definitely not the truth. Love is a choice and an action. What are some of the actions of love we read about in I Corinthians? With which part of love do you struggle most? What part of love is easier for you?

We will all struggle with one of the characteristics of love at some point in our life. The important thing is that we know where we struggle and ask God to help us in that area. The more we read our Bible and learn about Christ, the more we will be able to act like Christ; the more Christ-like we become, the more love we will show to others.



God is the source of our love: He loved us enough to sacrifice His Son for us. Jesus is the perfect example of love; everything He did in life and death was ultimate love. The Holy Spirit gives us the power to love; He lives in us to make us more like Christ. We have a choice to love like God. How do you show your love for God in the choices you make and the actions you take? God's kind of love is always directed toward others. When we think more about ourselves and our own wants, that is nothing but selfishness (and we ALL have issues with selfishness—it is part of our sin nature). Every morning, we need to pray for God to give us the power to make good choices, and to love others how HE wants us to love.

MISSIONARY STORIES

AMY CARMICHAEL

1867-1951

Amy Beatrice Carmichael was an Irish Christian missionary in India for 55 years. She is well known for rescuing children from trafficking in Hindu temples, opening an orphanage in India, founding the Dohnavur Fellowship, and writing several books and poems about Christ. Amy was born on December 16, 1867. Both her parents were Christians who taught Amy the fear of the Lord. When she was 15, Amy came to a saving knowledge of Christ. When she was about 18, father died from an illness. As the oldest child, Amy spent the next ten years helping her mother take care of her younger siblings.

In the mid-1880s, Amy discovered the Shawlies, poor local girls who worked at the mill for long hours and wore shawls because they could not afford hats. Amy shared the gospel with them and began a Bible study for the girls at her church. The study gained in popularity and grew so large that. Amy had to find a new building to accommodate all the girls. God provided the space and Amy ran that ministry until 1889, when she left to do similar work in Manchester.

Around that time, Amy also attended Keswick convention meetings. She heard Hudson Taylor, the founder of the China Inland Mission, talk about missionary work. Amy knew then and there that God was also calling her for foreign missions. But unfortunately, Amy suffered from nerve disease that prevented her from being approved as a missionary.

But Amy did not give up. On March 3, 1893, at age 26, Amy sailed for Japan with three other missionary women. But she had to return to England after only 15 months because of her disease. When Amy recovered from her illness, she was invited to volunteer in what is now Sri Lanka. She served there for a while, then went to Bangalore, India, in 1895. She stayed there for the rest of her life. Amy learned the Tamil language, talked to locals about Christ, and served persecuted Christian Indian women.

One day, a girl of 7 named Preena, who once heard Amy talk about God, ran away from a temple where she had been sold as a slave. Twice she had run away, and had been caught and severely punished. On her third attempt, she reached Amy's door seeking refuge. Amy took Preena in despite the possibility of being jailed.


Through this encounter, Amy became aware of the Hindu practice of selling little children as temple slaves and made it her life's mission to fight it. Over the next fifty years, Amy devoted her life to rescuing children, providing a home for them, and teaching them the love of Christ. In 1901, Amy moved to Dohnavur, India and started a rescue. Amy's rescuing mission was met with a lot of resistance from the Hindu priests. She was even threatened with prison charges. But Amy did not back down and continued accepting all who came to her for refuge. By 1913, the rescue had 130 girls and 30 Indian Christian women volunteers. Amy then opened a home for young boys in 1918, most of whom were former temple slaves. She became known as "Amma," which means mother in Tamil.

At 63, Amy had a bad fall that kept her bedridden for the remainder of her life. For twenty years, she continued her ministry from her bed, writing books and poems about the love of Christ and ministering to her children. She died in 1951, at 83, and was buried in Dohnavur. Her children put a bird bath over her tomb with the word "Amma" on it. During Amy's lifetime, the Dohnavur fellowship housed over 2,000 children; today, it still cares for needy children. Amy's life has left a longlasting legacy in India and inspired many other

missionaries like Jim and Elisabeth Elliot to pursue mission work and have a chance to die for Christ.

"When I consider the cross of Christ, how can anything that I do be called a sacrifice?" - Amy.

You are not too young to be used by God! In I Timothy 4, the apostle Paul reminded Timothy of that. Paul wanted Timothy to keep doing what God told him to do, not be concerned what other people would say. Sometimes there will be adults who don't really understand God's Word, and they will say things to young people to discourage them from doing and being what God wants. According to our verse (and song), how can you set an example for other believers:

If you are respectful to your parents, teachers, and other leaders you are setting a good example. If you are responsible with what you are given to do—chores, homework, other jobs—you are setting a good example. If you are kind to others and show love toward others, even if they may seem different than everyone else, you are setting a good example.



Respect is very important. We certainly should not have the attitude that "because God wants to use me, I don't need to be respectful." That totally goes against what God wants. If you are doing what God wants you to do every day, then that is the best way to allow God to use you. Every day, God wants us to read His Word, pray, rejoice, and give thanks in everything (I Thessalonians 5:16-18).

MISSIONARY STORIES JIM & ELISABETH ELLIOT

Jim and Elisabeth Elliot were two American missionaries to Ecuador and two of the most influential Christian figures of the 20th century. They became internationally known for their attempt to evangelize a primitive savage tribe and the brutal murder of Jim and four other missionaries.

Phillip James "Jim" Elliot was born in Portland, Oregon, on October 8, 1927. Jim confessed Christ when he was only six years old. From a young age, Jim knew he wanted to become a missionary and bring the gospel to unreached places. He had heard the stories of Christian missionaries like David Brainerd, William Carey, and Amy Carmichael and was inspired by their examples.

Elisabeth Howard was born in Belgium on December 21, 1926. Her parents were missionaries stationed in Brussels and she grew up in a strong Christian family where daily devotions occurred, and God's Word was preached. She grew up hearing stories of past missionaries such as David Brainerd, Amy Carmichael, and Mary Slessor and living missionaries such as Betty Stam which affirmed Elisabeth's desire to become a missionary.

Jim and Elisabeth met at Wheaton College and separately began serving in Ecuador. They soon married, and the newlyweds settled down in the Shandia mission base, ministered to the Indians, and welcomed their first daughter, Valerie. Jim and Elisabeth had a happy marriage and enjoyed their life and work among the Indians. But they both still felt a burden for the Aucas and were willing to do whatever it took to reach them.

One day, Nate Saint, a missionary in

Ecuador and a friend of the Elliots, sighted a small Auca settlement near the Cuaray river during one of his flights over the jungle. So Jim, Nate, and three other missionaries, Ed McCully, Pete Flemming, and Roger Youderian, started Operation Auca. For weeks, the team flew over the Auca settlement, dropped gifts, and shouted friendly phrases in the Auca language. When the Aucas responded and sent their own gifts, it excited the missionaries and their wives. It convinced them that God was opening a door at last.

So on January 3, 1956, the five missionaries went to the Cuaray river and resolved to stay there until the Aucas invited them to their camp. The first few days were uneventful. The missionaries waited for Aucas to come while shouting welcoming phrases to the jungle. On January 6, three Aucas, one male and two females, visited the missionaries' camp and spent the day with them. But they left without inviting the missionaries to their camp.

On January 7, Nate sighted that male Auca with some other Aucas coming their way with a friendly demeanor. The missionaries believed they were coming to invite them to their settlement, so they promised to radio their wives at 4:30 pm the next day to update them. But on the next day,

the radio remained silent.

When the Aucas arrived at the missionaries' camp on Sunday, January 8, 1956, they did not come to extend a hand of fellowship. Instead, they speared all five men to death and threw their bodies in the river. A search and rescue party recovered their remains later and buried them along the Cuaray river.

After the death of their husbands, the widows, remained in Ecuador and continued missionary work. None of the widows wanted revenge against the Aucas. Elisabeth longed to reach the Aucas with even greater urgency since Jim had given up his life for them. After two years of uncertainty and prayers, Elisabeth finally received the long-awaited invitation to visit the Auca camp. The invitation came from two Auca women who had come to see the missionary base.

So in October 1958, Elisabeth, her three-year-old daughter Valerie, and Rachel Saint (Nate Saint's sister) moved in with the Auca tribe. Elisabeth stayed there for two years, working on translating the Bible into their language and sharing the gospel. Many of the Aucas came to Christ, and one of the first converts was Mincaye, a man who personally speared two of the American five. The Aucas then became known as the Waorani tribe, as Auca was a pejorative term used by the Indians. Elisabeth returned to the US for good in 1963, wrote many Christian books, and traveled around the country to teach the Bible and share

the story of Operation Auca. On June 15, 2015, Elisabeth Elliot passed into glory in Magnolia, Massachusetts, at 88.

Jim and Elisabeth Elliot left an enduring legacy in the Christian world that is still felt today. Jim Elliot, Nate Saint, Ed McCully, Pete Fleming, and Roger Youderian's devotion and sacrifice inspired countless Christians to give their all for Christ, whether in the mission field or at home. And Elisabeth influenced many Christians, particularly women, to live in utter obedience to Christ and learn that the losses we suffer here are nothing compared to what we will receive in glory. As Jim famously said, "He is no fool who gives what he cannot keep to gain that which he cannot lose."



For a long time that was how it was supposed to be. But everything changed after Jesus came. God sent Jesus for EVERYONE—not just for one group of people. The story of Peter & Cornelius is after Jesus died on the cross, rose again, and went back to heaven.

What do you know about Cornelius after reading Acts 10:1-2?			
Would you say he was "different" than Peter?			

God spoke to Cornelius to go get Peter, then God spoke to Peter to go with Cornelius' men. First, God had to teach Peter a lesson. In verse 15, what did God tell Peter?

There were laws about what the Jewish people could and could not eat. Peter was obeying the law. However, God gave him a new law–if God had cleansed something, do not consider it unholy. God was using the meat as an example to show Peter that Jesus came for all people–not just the

Jews! God's love is for everyone!



Peter & Cornelius were very different people. Cornelius was wealthy, a Gentile, and a military man. Peter was a Jewish fisherman turned preacher. God's plan included both of them! They each discovered the importance of God working in the other person's life. Cornelius needed Peter and his gospel to know the way to salvation; Peter needed Cornelius and his salvation experience to know that Gentiles were included in God's plan.

MISSIONARY STORIES JOHN & BETTY STAM



John and Betty Stam were two American missionaries who served in China in the mid-1900s. They are well known for their capture and beheading by Chinese communist soldiers. Elisabeth "Betty" Scott was born on February 22, 1906, in Albion, Michigan. Her father, Charles E. Scott, was a professor who became a pastor and then a missionary. Shortly after Betty's birth, Charles was asked to serve as a missionary in China. So, he moved his little family to China, where Betty grew up.

When she was 17, Betty returned to the United States for college and then attended Moody Bible Institute (MBI) to prepare for mission work in China. While at MBI, Betty met John Stam, a fellow student who matched her zeal for Christ and commitment to serve Him. John was born on January 18, 1907, in a godly Dutch immigrant family. He grew up with the knowledge of God and confessed Christ as Lord and Savior at an early age. He soon sensed God was calling him to the missionary field in China. And like Betty, John enrolled at Moody Bible Institute for preparation. They both went to Shanghai, China and were married in 1933. A year later, after the birth of daughter Helen, they moved to Jingde and the Stam's lives turned upside down.

On the morning of December 6, while Betty was bathing the baby, she heard gunshots nearby. Communist soldiers had marched into the city and were going house to house, taking captives. By then, it was too late for the Stams to run, so they stayed and entrusted themselves to God. The soldiers found the Stams in their home and arrested them with many others. When they arrived at the Red Army's headquarters, the communists made John write a letter to CIM

demanding a \$20,000 ransom. John wrote the letter and closed it with, "The Lord bless and guide you—and as for us—may God be glorified whether by life or by death." The letter never got delivered.

On the next day, the soldiers marshaled the prisoners for 12 miles and stopped for the night at the residence of a local merchant who had fled. The following day, before soldiers and prisoners resumed their journey, Betty hid baby Helen in a blanket bundle and left her behind. The soldiers never noticed the baby's absence. When they arrived at their destination, they stripped the Stams of their outer garments, knelt them to the ground, and killed them. John and Betty were 27 and 28 years old.

Thirty hours later, a local pastor found little Helen in the house with money pinned to her cloth. He used it to provide for her and take her to safety. She was then sent to the United States, where her grandparents raised her. The Stams were buried in China. Their gravestones read, John Cornelius Stam, January 18, 1907, "That Christ may be glorified whether by life or by death." Philippians 1:20

Elisabeth Scott Stam, February 22, 1906, "For me to live is Christ and to die is gain." Philippians 1:21 December 8, 1934, Miaosheo, Anhui, "Be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life." Revelation 2:10

The impact of the martyrdom of the Stams on the evangelical world cannot be overstated. They incited hundreds of young Christians, such as Elisabeth Elliot, to lay down their lives for Christ and glorify Him, whether by death or life.



READ ACTS 10:24-43

Peter went to Cornelius' house. What was the scene when Peter arrived in verse 24?

Wow! Cornelius wanted his whole family and friends to hear about Jesus! One of the key verses in this chapter is verse 34. What does Peter finally understand?

Peter shared with Cornelius and his entire household that God's love is for everyone. In God's eyes, everyone is the same—we are all sinners who need Jesus! Peter gave a short yet powerful sermon that was to the point: Jesus' lived a perfect life of servanthood; His death on the cross; His resurrection (personally witnessed by Peter); Jesus' fulfillment of the Scriptures; and the necessity of personal faith in Him. Cornelius and his entire household accepted Jesus as Savior!



You and I are different from Peter also (unless your background is Jewish). We are considered Gentiles. Aren't you thankful that Jesus did not just come to save one group of people, but that He came for EVERYONE! If God did not withhold His love from us, why should we hold it back from others??? We should share God's love with EVERYONE, regardless of how they look or how they act.





MISSIONARY STORIES MARY SLESSOR 1848-1915



Mary Mitchell Slessor was a Scottish Presbyterian missionary to the Efik people in Nigeria. She spent 40 years in Nigeria teaching the Bible to the Efik people, promoting women's rights, protecting children, and fighting against the infanticide of twins common among the Ibibio people. She is known today as one of Africa's most influential missionaries. Mary was born on December 2, 1848, in

Mary was born on December 2, 1848, in Aberdeen, Scotland. Her father was a raging alcoholic who lost his job as a shoemaker due to his addiction. When Mary was 11, she also worked at the Dundee jute mill as a half-timer; she spent half of her day working at the mill and the other half attending school. She worked at the mill full-time when she finished her education at 14.

Mary's mother received the Missionary Record, a monthly magazine published by the United Presbyterian Church that featured stories of missionaries worldwide. Mary used to read the magazine and was captivated by missionaries' stories, particularly Livingstone's adventures in Africa. It sparked in her the desire to become a missionary. Hence, when Mary heard of Livingstone's Death in 1873, she resolved to follow in his footsteps and continue his work in Africa. Three years later, when Mary was about 28, she applied to be a missionary with the Foreign Mission Board of the United Presbyterian Church of Scotland. She trained for missionary work in Edinburg for a few months, then sailed for Calabar, Nigeria, on August 5, 1876.

Upon her arrival in Calabar, Mary quickly witnessed the horrific practices of the people. Like Livingstone before her, she abhorred the

evil practices rampant on the continent and worked tirelessly to abolish them. However, Mary contracted Malaria and had to return to Scotland.

Upon her return to Africa, Mary went to places where no missionaries had gone before. She adopted the culture of the locals, lived with them as one of them, and eventually gained their trust and respect. Besides sharing the gospel, Mary also rescued twin babies from being murdered by tribal leaders and ministered to mothers of twins who were often left to die.

During her time in Nigeria, Mary traveled further and further into the interior of Old Town. She went from village to village, sharing the gospel and rescuing twin babies from murder. She even went to live with the Okoyong tribe, infamous for their violence, drugs, and slavery. Mary lived with that tribe for fifteen years and adopted all the practices she could without breaking the law of God. As a result, she helped resolve the violence within the tribe, encouraged trade, and won souls for Christ. Mary continued to spread the good news of Christ to unreached tribes. She died on January 13, 1915, surrounded by many children she had rescued. The people who named her "Everybody's mother," deeply mourned her death.

Mary Slessor left a long-lasting legacy in Nigeria through her love and sacrifice. God used her to transform the beliefs of a nation, rescue hundreds of children from infanticides, and, more importantly, turn many to Christ.



MISSIONARY STORIES ADONIRAM & ANN JUDSON

Adoniram and Ann Judson were one of the first American missionaries to go overseas. They served in Burma, now Myanmar, and led thousands of Burmese to Christ. They translated the entire Bible into Burmese, established hundreds of churches in the area, and began the first-ever English-Burmese dictionary.

Adoniram was born to a pastor on August 9th, 1788, in Malden, Massachusetts. When he was 20, Adoniram befriended a skeptic who caused him to renounce his faith. But when this friend fell sick and died, Adoniram's views were shaken. He returned to the faith and made a "solemn dedication of himself to God." Shortly after his conversion, Adoniram felt called to the mission field. He was commissioned in 1810. Later he met his wife Ann, married in 1812 and sailed to India. They were there only a few months before going to Burma in July, 1813.

While in Burma, the Judsons faced significant hardship in ministry. They had a slow start due to the difficulty of learning the language and the people's resistance. It took three years before a Burmese got converted to Christianity. And the Baptist church they founded only had 12 members after 12 years in Burma. Personal trials also grieved Adoniram and Ann. They lost their second child to disease within their first two years in Burma. Then in 1822, Ann felt gravely ill and had to be evacuated to the US for treatment for two years, leaving Adoniram alone in Burma.

Upon Ann's return in 1824, the Judsons relocated to Ava, the capital city of Burma. But shortly after their arrival, Adoniram was imprisoned by the Burmese government under suspicion of being a spy during the Burmese and British war. Adoniram was detained for 17 months while pregnant Ann relentlessly lobbied

for her husband's release. She also supported him with food, water, and total devotion. Adoniram was eventually released, but he returned to a severely ill wife. And on October 24th, 1826, Ann died. Then six months later, their baby daughter also died.

Adoniram was profoundly griefstricken and went through a dark time. But by God's grace, he prevailed and continued his missionary work. His ministry finally became fruitful; he saw hundreds of Burmese become Christians and he finished the Burmese Bible translation. In 1850, Adoniram became ill and died on the journey to England to receive medical treatment. His parting words were, "The Love of Christ, Boundless in its breadth, Infinite in its length, Fathomless in its depths, And measureless in its height. In these deserts let me labor, On these mountains let me tell, How he died, the blessed Savior, To redeem a world from hell."

Adoniram and Ann Judson show how God can redeem our sufferings for His glory. Their lives were grains of wheat that fell into the ground of Myanmar and bore much fruit. (John 12:24).


