REVERSE TRICK-OR-TREATING

Halloween is the one night of the year when neighbors are home and eager to answer the door. What a great chance to be generous and surprise them with a twist on traditional trick-or-treating.

Simply purchase full size candy bars, bags of candy, certificates for ice cream, coffee, donuts, or other treats, and go house to house handing them out.

Reverse trick-or-treating is a great way to remind ourselves and those in our household of Acts 20:35 – "...It is more blessed to give than to receive."

AUTUMN BLESSINGS

Prepare a special treat bag or basket full of fall fun with an invitation to church (printable tags and invites can be found on our website!) for your neighbors.

Carefully and quietly leave it on their front porch. Have the kids ring your neighbor's doorbell and run!

IDEAS IF YOUR FAMILY IS

Staying In

This year when Jacksonville shows up for treats, let's not disappoint! One of the best ways to embrace the busyness of the evening is to get outside and greet your neighbors!

While it's tempting (and easy!) to turn the front porch light off, we want to encourage you to get outside. If you stay inside and only answer the door when the doorbell rings, you lose an opportunity to intentionally get to know those around you.

Here are a few ways to make your night at home fun for everyone:

BE PREPARED

Make plans to decorate and dress up.

BE ENTHUSIASTIC, ENGAGING, AND ENCOURAGING

Be welcoming

Ask about their costumes

Introduce yourself to the parents

Ask about hobbies and interests

BE GENEROUS AND GRACIOUS

Hand out the best candy.

Remember not everyone says, "Thank you!"

Sometimes neighbors are short and even rude, so remember to give extra grace tonight!



When teenagers come to your door, make them feel welcome without asking, "Aren't you too old to trick-or-treat?" Remember, there are so many other places they could be spending their night. Simply pass out candy and wish them a safe night.

BE PRAYERFUL

Begin praying now for those who will come by your house on October 31.

While not everyone is comfortable to chat with every trick-or-treater, everyone can pray. You may not want to strike up conversation with each family that stops by, but we encourage you to pray over each child. As you place candy in the treat bag, pray for protection, for salvation, blessing, and direction for that child and the family represented.

WAYS TO LOVE YOUR

INVITE YOUR NEIGHBORS OVER FOR A PRE-TRICK-OR-TREAT PARTY

Bring your grill to the driveway and offer hot dogs, water, juice boxes, and snacks to your neighbors.

IDEAS TO TRY

Glow Sticks

Glow sticks are great party favors! Kids love them, and they are helpful for parents as families are out after dark.



Pay a visit to your closest dollar store for glow sticks. You can find as many as 10/\$1!

Costume Contest

Consider hosting a costume contest for your neighbors and award a small prize.

Water Bottles

If you've ever toted children around your neighborhood trick-or-treating, you know it can be a workout! Consider passing out cold water bottles to parents. Use the printable labels found on our website and wrap them around your favorite water bottles. Secure with tape.

Lawn Games

Set up simple lawn games or mini carnival-style games. You probably have everything you need around your house already! Some ideas are:

Bean Bag Toss - toss bean bags at a target, set up cornhole boards, or decorate 5-gallon buckets to create a DIY skiball game.

Hidden Treasure - Let your young guests search for buried treasure in a kiddie pool or sandbox filled with sand, packing peanuts, or shredded paper.

Basketball - If you have a basketball hoop already in your driveway, set up a game of horse for prizes and candy.

Mini Trunk-of-Treats

Gather a few friends and decorate your trunks in your driveway for a mini trunk-of-treats.

Driveway Movie

If you have a projector and a white sheet, you have everything you need for a great outdoor movie night! Let your neighbors know ahead of time so they can make plans to join you.
